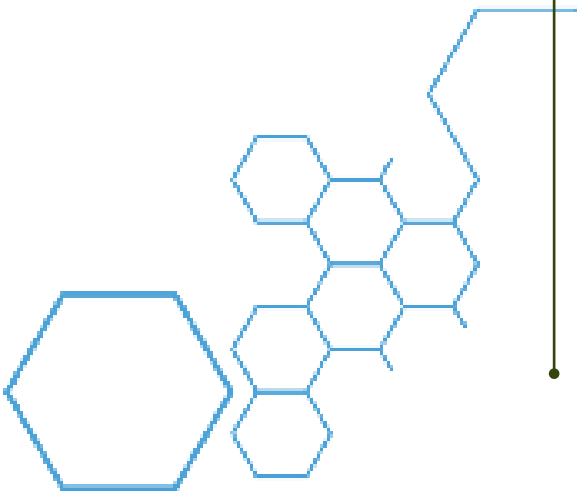

Industry Overview

IT BY THE NUMBERS

Since 2001, the IT industry in South Dakota has grown significantly, more than doubling its presence in the state.

The IT industry in South Dakota employs more than 1,500 people within 425 establishments and pays an average wage of \$60,206.

The average size of an IT company in South Dakota is 3.6 employees. Comparatively, the average size of an IT company in the United States is 8.3 employees.

Key segments in South Dakota's IT Industry include Computer Systems Design Services, Custom Computer Programming Services, and Data Processing, Hosting & Related Services. Computer Systems Design Services has seen the most significant growth in South Dakota, doubling its presence in the state. Data Processing, Hosting & Related Services saw a 61.1% increase in the number of establishments in the state.

From 2001-2009, the number of establishments engaged in IT activities in the state grew by 64.7%, outpacing the Nation's rate of growth of 26.4%.

EMPLOYMENT

From 2001-2009, the number of employees working in IT establishments in the state grew by 66.2%, outpacing the Nation's rate of growth of 4.0%.

ANNUAL PAY

From 2001-2009, the Annual Pay in the IT field in South Dakota grew by 34.8%, compared to the Nation's growth of 21.0%.

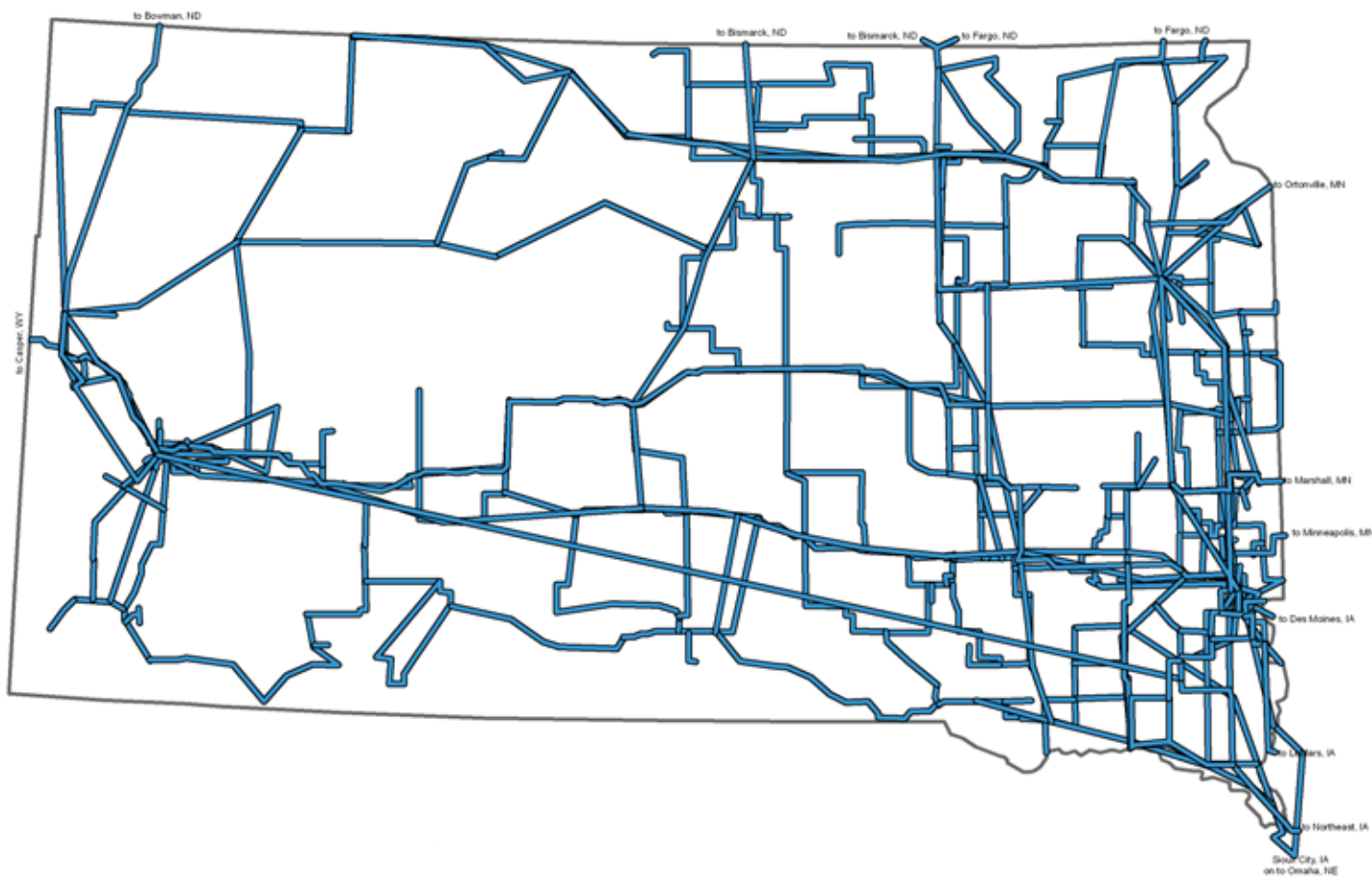
Business high speed line adoption grew substantially with a 693% growth in the Dec-07 to Jun-08 time frame; growing from 24,000 to over 190,000 business lines. The rapid growth in business lines during this time frame is responsible for nearly doubling the total high speed lines in South Dakota. And this growth is not slowing.

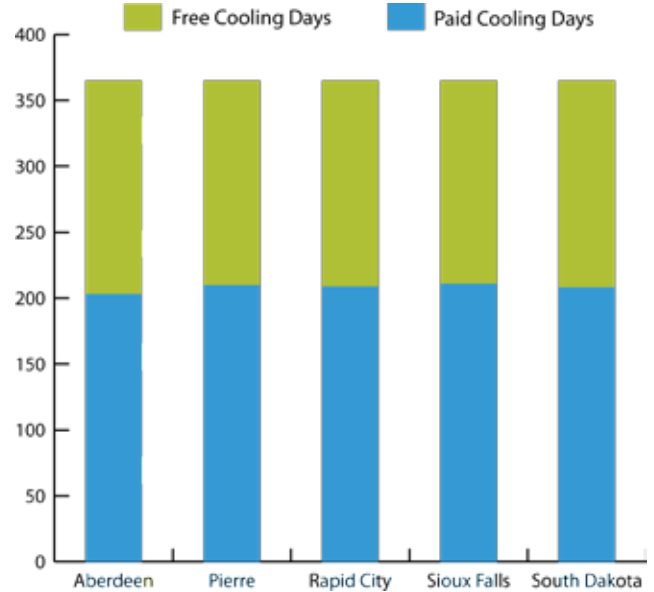

CLIMATE

South Dakota has a cooler environment compared to much of the nation. Specifically, South Dakota is the 44th warmest state in the nation with an average daily mean temperature of 45.1 degrees F. For comparison, Hawaii has the warmest mean temperature of 77.5 degrees F.

Our lower temperatures make it more economical to cool data center operations. On average, South Dakota offers 157 days under 55 degrees, ideal for free cooling.



NATURAL HAZARDS

South Dakota is a safe place to live, work, and conduct business. For at least the past 30 years (if not longer) South Dakota has escaped major weather disasters.

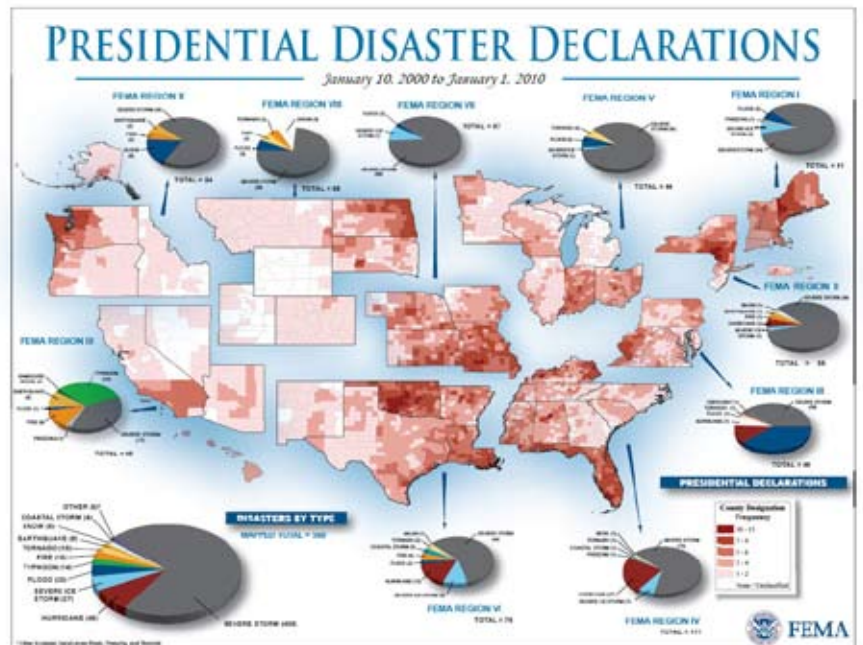
In South Dakota, you don't have to worry about hurricanes, tropical storms, or typhoons. Natural elements that can pose a problem include:

- Severe Storms
- Tornadoes
- Flooding
- Blizzards/Freezing
- Drought/Fire

Earthquakes do occur though they are rare and damage is minimal.

Despite these risk elements, South Dakota has had 18 major disaster declarations since 2000 and they

have all centered around severe storms. Seven fire management assistance declarations were also needed to control hazardous fire situations during an extended drought that began around 2000 and eased in 2008. Currently there are no drought conditions in South Dakota.



EARTHQUAKES

1872-2009

Since 1872 South Dakota has experienced a total of 83 earthquakes. These earthquakes have ranged in intensity from 3 to 6 on the Modified Mercalli Scale (MM), meaning that often-times earthquakes were never felt, but if felt they were mild and sustained damage was minimal. Also, most of these earthquakes occurred in sparsely populated, rural areas and did not adversely affect the population. Following are more details on South Dakota's seismic activity:

- The most recent earthquake occurred on February 7th, 2007 at 10:35am near Rapid City, South Dakota in the Black Hills. The quake had a Richter magnitude of 3.1.
- Only 7 of South Dakota's 83 earthquakes have registered a Level 6 MM Intensity which is described as "felt by all, many frightened. Some heavy furniture moved; a few instances of fallen plaster. Damage slight."
- The most recent Level 6 MM Intensity quake occurred in 1983.
- South Dakota has not experienced earthquakes beyond a Level 6 MM Intensity.

REGULATION

BUSINESS COSTS

Utilities

South Dakota’s utility providers range from Investor Owned, to Rural Electric Co-ops, to Municipal Utilities, giving you the advantage of competitive pricing. This competition gives South Dakota the 6th lowest electricity price in the nation and keeps electricity costs well below the national average.

- In 2009, Commercial Electricity customers in South Dakota paid an average price of 7.14 cents per kwh while the average Commercial U.S. customer paid 10.26 cents per kwh.
- Further, since 1990, South Dakota’s Commercial Electric price per kwh has increased by 0.46 cents, the 3rd lowest increase in the nation. Comparatively, the average U.S. Commercial Electric price rose 2.92 cents per kwh.

Water and sewer systems are most often controlled locally, by the municipal utilities, a benefit that keeps your water and sewer rates low.

Cost Analysis of Locating a Data Center

The Boyd Company, Inc. out of Princeton, New Jersey conducted a comparative cost analysis for information assurance operations, viable for the 2008 planning period. The results of their cost analysis showed Sioux Falls, SD to be the least expensive location for these kinds of operations.

THE ANALYSIS WAS BASED ON:

- A 75-worker information assurance center
- Situated in a 125,000-sq.ft. facility within the banking and financial services industry
- Operating costs were calculated accordingly
- Costs were projected for 45 U.S. cities
- The initial 31 cities represent major head office locations of the nation's leading banking and financial service organizations
- An additional 14 U.S. cities were chosen based on their best meeting a series of critical site selection factors developed by Boyd Company

TAXES

Income Tax

Not only does South Dakota have no income tax, the location of a data center in South Dakota can substantially reduce your state income tax expense in other states. This is due to the fact that revenues from services are typically sourced to the state where the service was performed (South Dakota) for state income tax apportionment purposes. Additionally your payroll and property apportionment percentages in other states are reduced because of your investment in South Dakota. A data center in South Dakota creates major income tax savings opportunities.

Workers Compensation

In South Dakota, employers can insure workers by the type of work done, not the overall company code, a procedure that often results in greater savings. Also, South Dakota workers compensation is not charged against vacation, sick or holiday pay which can save you approximately 10 percent on workers compensation costs.

In South Dakota, insurers are permitted to apply up to a 25 percent credit on a company's final workers compensation premium if the company qualifies after a safety or loss control inspection, and if the company agrees to the safety recommendations of the insurer.

Unemployment Insurance

The average unemployment insurance rate for experienced employers is 2.06 percent. The wage base is \$11,000. For new employers the rate is 1.75 percent for the first year's operation and 1.55 percent for the second and third years if the company's account balance is positive. Thereafter, the rate is based on the company's experience.

Real Property Tax

Local real property taxes vary from 1 to 4 percent of the actual value of the structure, with most rates falling around 3 percent. The assessed value of a property is currently considered 85% of the market value. Property taxes are then calculated based on the assessed value of the property.

Sales & Use Tax

Manufacturing operations are subject to sales tax in South Dakota for any new machinery and equipment brought in for the new operation. Any machinery and equipment that is seven years old or more is exempt from the sales tax in South Dakota.

State Sales Tax: 4.0%
 Local Sales Tax: 0.0% to 2.0%

TAX ABATEMENTS & REFUNDS

Property Tax Abatement

County commissioners may, at their discretion, forgive from zero to 100 percent of the property taxes on a new structure or an addition to an existing one. This abatement may be available on all industrial, commercial and non-residential agricultural structures valued at \$30,000 or more.

Sales, Use & Contractors' Excise Tax Refund

South Dakota offers tax refunds (sales, use and contractors' excise taxes) for new and expanding business facilities. To be eligible for the refund the total cost of a project must be a minimum of \$10 million and an application must be filed with the Dept. of Revenue & Regulation 180 days (approx. 6 months) from the start of construction.

The amount of the refund on the sales, use and contractors' excise tax is determined by the total project costs.

REDI (Revolving Economic Development & Initiative) **Fund****

- Provides permanent financing for land, building, machinery and equipment, and associated installation costs
- 3 percent fixed interest rate available to start-ups or expansions
- Amortization up to 20 years, based on useful life of financed asset(s)
- Five-year balloon
- Minimum 10 percent equity contribution; total REDI loan amount no greater than 45 percent of total project costs
- Job creation is a factor in determining loan amount
- 1.5 percent origination fee

EDFA (Economic Development Finance Authority)**

- Designed for more capital-intensive projects
- Lower interest rates to the borrower as a result of "A" rating by Standard and Poors

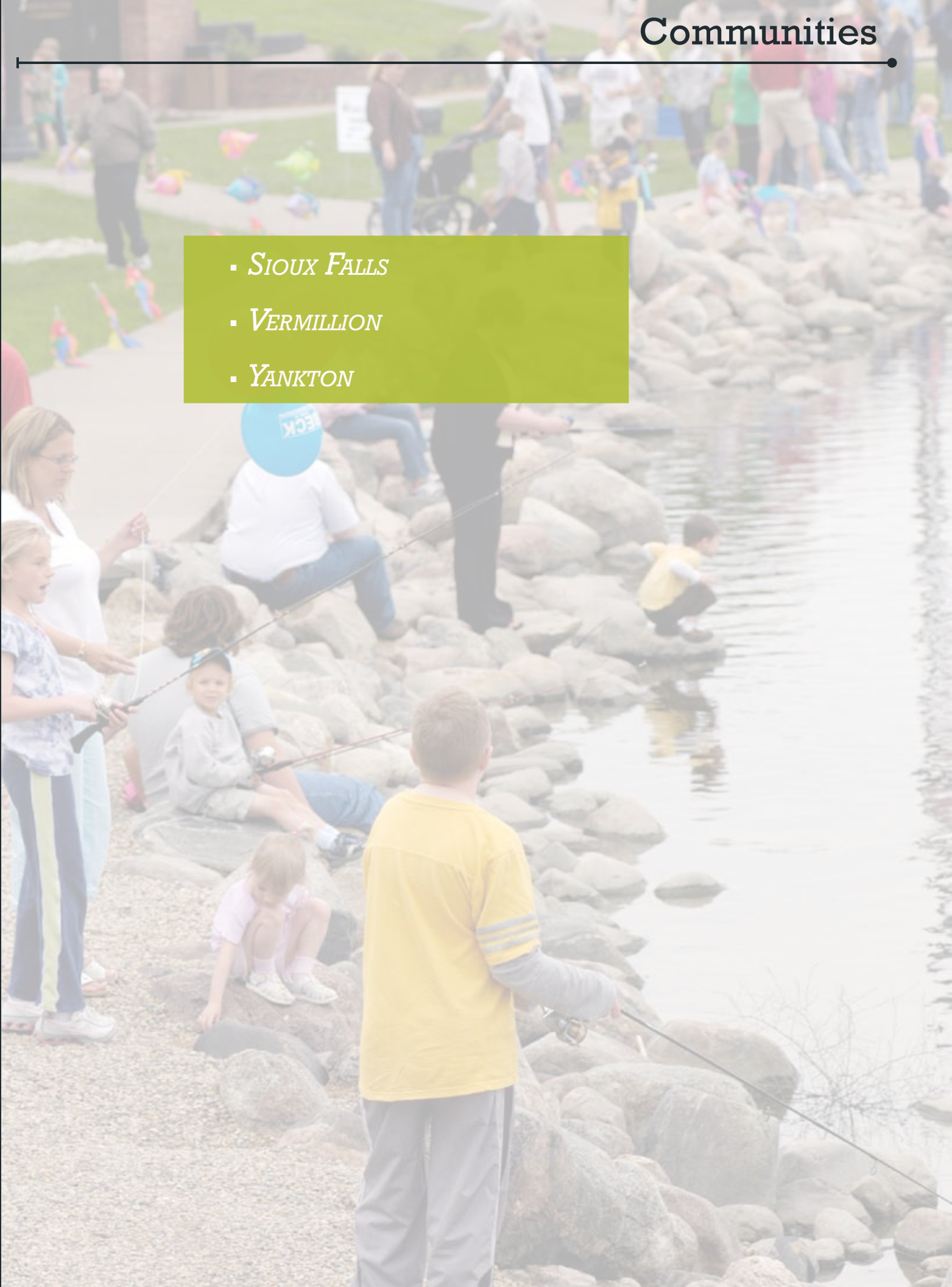
APEX (Agricultural Processing & Exporting) Fund**

- Assist companies that add value to ag products through processing

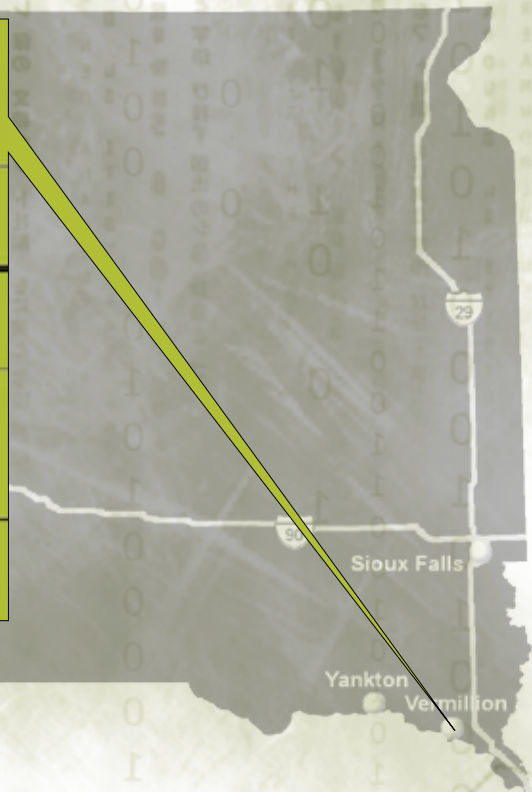

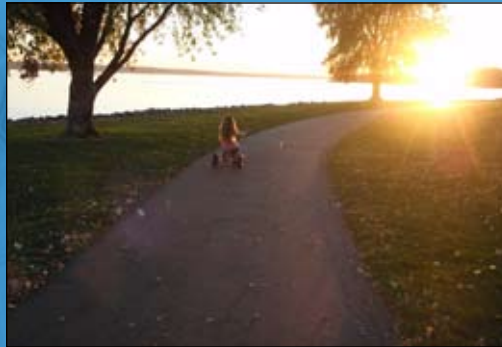

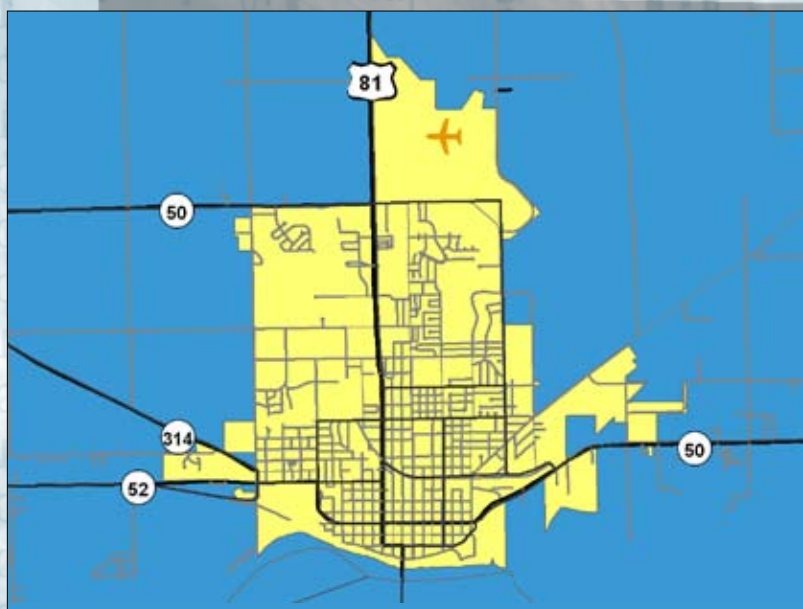
